

Chief among the changes are a newly recognized diagnosis (prolonged grief disorder), codes to clearly articulate suicidal and non-suicidal self-injury, modifications to criteria sets for over 70 disorders, and comprehensive edits to languaging throughout the DSM to better reflect a commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion. This presentation provided a primer to understanding the DSM revisions that are most likely to affect clinical practice in an outpatient setting. Limitations were also discussed.

Among the goals of this course are to see students commit to being more than a psychologist technician; to encourage them to develop a guiding philosophical core in their practice as a psychologist; to assist them in clarifying or deepening of whatever philosophical worldview they may hold; and achieve an informed understanding of radical behaviorism/functional contextualism - whether or not they choose to further pursue these models.
